Since 1995, The Connecticut Society for Public Health Education (CT SOPHE) has recognized and celebrated National Health Education Week during the third week of October. National Health Education Week, taking place October 17th- 21st, 2022, is aimed to increase awareness of major public health issues and to promote a better understanding of the role of health education and health promotion.

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, local health educators and public health professionals have met virtually to share their experiences and work together to ensure quality health and services to their community members.
